Mr. Reynolds was saved on March 26, 1991, at age seven in Arkansas. He lived in Arkansas for three years before moving to Germany

due to his father's job with the Department of Defense (DOD). He lived there for almost three years. Because of that job, the Reynolds moved to several other places including Italy and Switzerland. When he

was thirteen, his family moved to Geneseo, Illinois; while living there, his mother began to attend First Baptist Church. Mr. Reynolds went as well, mainly because his father forced him to go. At age sixteen, he started playing on the church's basketball teamthis is when he first started getting involved at church. His friend Joel also played on the team, and he and Mr. Reynolds even got the chance to work together. Because he was surrounded by so many godly Christian

> influences, Reynolds made better choices and became serious about church. Two of the most important decisions he made during his teen years were destroying his worldly music CDs and gaining better

friends. He surrendered his life to the Lord at a teen camp.

Although he had planned to attend a community college, Mr. Reynolds felt God leading him to a Bible college, even though he hardly knew anything about them. God led him to Golden State Baptist College, where he met his wife, Faith. They came to Geth-

Sarah Edmonds born in December of 1841. Unfortunately, her parents wanted a boy and treated her quite badly. Sometime in the 1850s, Edmonds ran away from home and found a job selling Bibles; it was around this time that she began to dress as a man. In 1861, Edmonds, using the alias of Frank Thompson, enlisted in the Union army. While serving as a private in the army, she was involved in the battles of Bull Run, Antietam, and Fredericksburg; she also went undercover as a spy behind Confederate lines, disguising herself first as a slave, then as an Irish peddler. Edmonds even had the opportunity to serve under Ulysses Grant, but malaria

forced her to leave the army. Edmonds then left for Washington and became a nurse. During this time she published a fictional ac-



count of her service entitled 'Nurse and Spy in the Union Army." Later in life, she married and had children. She was eventually granted a pension from Congress for her service. which made her the

only woman to be publicly recognized as a member of the Union army.


