The History of Comic Books



Comic books are notorious for giving a cinematic feel without any actual movement happening, but did you know they date back all the way to ancient Egypt? The Egyptian hieroglyphics were actually one of the first instances where pictures were used to tell a story or an event.

Now fast forward to to the first American comic strip. The first comic strip was titled "The Yellow Kid" and featured a child and cataloged his adventures. The first comic book was titled "Famous Funnies". This was really more of a compilation of all the comic strips in one place more than anything.

In 1938 the golden age of comic books began. The golden age is a term referring to how good the comics are and how long they have been out. The age ranks are: Bronze Age, Silver age, and Golden age. The Golden age created heroes such as: Wonder Woman, Batman, Green lantern, Captain America, and Captain Marvel. During the Golden age these heroes became symbolic in WW2, and in some covers were Captain American was depicted fighting Hitler.

After comics had become more streamlined it became apparent that there should be standers and codes to what people could write and depict. Some authors were going way too far with the content they were putting their stories. So the government put codes so that the kids would not become little criminals by attempting actions that they saw in the comics. So the stamp of approval was born.

After some time had passed and technology had advance digital comics became more popular. Then they wanted to adapt them into films. So the Marvel cinematic universe and The DC cinematic universe was made!

<u>Timeline:</u>

1938- the Golden Age of comic books.

1956- the birth of The Flash 1956- the Silver Age began 1980's- Stan Lee began to create heroes, most notably Spider-Man; Marvel and DC go head to head.

OBSCURE SPORTS: SEPAK TAKRAW

Imagine if in soccer whenever you scored a goal, you were required to jump 5 feet in the air and bicycle kick it in the goal. Or picture in volleyball if you were only allowed to use your legs to hit or block the ball. A sport called Sepak Takraw that originated in Malaysia, meets all these requirements.

In Malaysia, around the 15th century, the sport

Sepak Takraw was born. This sport is pretty much a combination of volleyball and soccer. As in volleyball, a net divides the two teams, but this net is only five feet tall. The two teams consist of only three players, and these players are allowed to set, block, and hit the ball. As mentioned before, this must all be done with their feet, and this would make blocking and hitting more difficult, for it will

require your feet to be above the net.

The name Sepak Takraw literally means "to kick a ball"; "sepak" meaning kick and "takraw" means ball. This sport is traditionally played with a ball made of bamboo or rattan which is stems of the palm tree. The court upon which it is played is roughly 44 feet by 20



feet. Sepak Takraw is popular in Southeast Asia and has been in the Southeast Asia Games since 1967. This sport will not be appearing in the 2020 Olympics Games but is expected in the Olympic Games in 2024. In my opinion, I would enjoy if this became more popular outside Asia. It would be exciting to see its interesting rallies on TV. A typical Sepak Takraw rally would be the tekong or server serving the ball, the

opposite team receives the serve. The feeder or setter sets the ball ten feet in the air, all done with the feet of course, and the striker or killer

would jump high in the air and swing his leg around to strike the ball down with brutal force. Who knows? If it did become popular in the U.S., maybe we could have a team for school.


animal farm. It'll end up costing you a day at Disneyland by the time you're through.

George was born on February 22, 1732, in Westmoreland County, Virginia. His father died when he was eleven years old, so he moved to



Fredericksburg with his mother. At the age of fourteen Washington had planned to join the British navy but then reluctantly stayed home in obedience to his mother's wishes.

When George was twenty years old, he joined the militia. He fought in the French and Indian War, where shortly

after, he was promoted to colonel. After this, he married his wife Martha, and returned to his life in Mount Vernon.

George Washington fought in the battle of Trenton, where he and his army had to cross the bone chilling Delaware River in order to surprise the Hessians at their fort. On December 26, 1776, General Washington and his troops had defeated the Hessians. George Washington was a hero.

Washington was elected to the Virginia House of Burgesses in 1758 as a representative from Frederick County. This was the start of George Washington's political career. Throughout the Revolutionary years Washington developed military leadership, administrative skills, and political sharpness. His wartime experiences gave him a sense of importance among the colonies. Finally, Washington led the proceedings at the Federal Convention in 1787 that led to confirmation of the new


