OBSCURE SPORTS: CHESS BOXING

Chess has been around for more than a thousand years. Some historians believe that chess was invented in the sixth century. Many have also said that it was born in Northern India. Others believe that it came from China, but it did become popular throughout Asia. The game of chess is very complex, and the chess that we play today is very different from the chess that was first made. It requires skill and concentration, and it takes patience because one game of chess could last hours.

Wait, but is chess a sport? No, according to dictionary.com chess is not a sport because it does not require "athletic skills," but chess boxing

is a sport. Chess boxing is exactly what it sounds like: a combination of chess and boxing. Chess boxing was made in 1992 by Enki Bilal, who came up with this idea for his comic. And in 2003, Iepe Rubingh organized actual matches based on the descriptions of the sport.



The game of chess boxing consists of eleven rounds that are three minutes each. Each round the two players must alternate from boxing to chess. There are six rounds of chess leaving the remaining five rounds for boxing. The game starts out with the two playing chess. After three minutes, they play an intense match of boxing. The round then changes back to playing chess and so on and so forth.

The first game of chess boxing was played by Jean Louis Veestra and Iepe Rubingh, the guy who co-created the sport. Rubingh won the match. This match helped make chess boxing become popular, for it was watched by over a thousand people. He founded the World Chess Boxing Organization the same year of the match. And in 2004, he created the first Chess Boxing Club in Berlin, Germany. Since then, this unique sport has grown popular in countries like China, England, Russia, Germany, and many more.

Apparently, chess boxing is pretty well-known around the US, but I think I've only heard about it once before writing this article. On a different note, chess boxing is interesting because it requires the skills of both chess and boxing. So in order to play chess boxing you must have concentration and strategy; but not only that, you must also have strength and endurance.

FIRES IN AUSTRALIA

For many weeks ash, soot, and blackened vegetation produced by raging bush fires have collected along the shorelines of New South Wales in Australia, clogging the waves and lapping in the tides. Originating in fires blazing into forested areas, the debris has been carried on the breeze along with a pungent bushfire smoke that blanketed Australia's largest city for much of December.



As of press time, more than 26 million acres, an area bigger than Portugal, have now burned, mostly in the continent's south east region. That includes areas such as: watersheds, dams, lakes and rivers. It is an ecological disaster unprecedented in Australia's history. And that spells trouble for drinking water supplies, coastal ecosystems, and the freshwater rivers that support the iconic Australian wildlife.


Officials in Australia are working hard to provide animals with food to eat amid the destruction of their environment. Thousands of pounds of sweet potatoes and carrots have been dropped from the sky across New South Wales as the National Parks and wildlife service scrambles to save the marsupials. The airdrop mission was the most widespread food drop ever done for wildlife.

With at least 28 people dead, more than 3,000 homes destroyed, and more than 100 fires still burning and a species known as the rock wallaby going extinct, we hope and pray that this will all be over and everything will all turn out to be ok.

Highly Advanced Interlocking Brick Systems

Legos have always been a great childhood memory of many adults and children alike. They were created by a carpenter named Ole Kirk Christiansen in the year 1934. In 1947, he started using a plastic called cellulose acetate to create his toys. These were not the bricks we know but other types of toys. In 1950, his son Godtfred Kirk Christiansen became vice president of the company and took over toy production. It was then that they started making bricks that could connect together. In 1955, they became a world class company and started to export toys to other countries. After many decades and changes to the color and shape of the bricks, the LEGO company has expanded to the global company they are now. They now make over 19 billion blocks a year in 51 different colors. The largest LEGO creation was an X-wing that used over 5 million bricks.

Tech Talk: The Oculus Quest

Is it possible to escape reality? According to dictionary.com, Virtual reality is the computer-generated simulation of a three-

dimensional image or environment that can be interacted with in a seemingly real or physical way by a person using special electronic equipment, such as a helmet with a screen inside or gloves fitted with sensors. For the duration of this article, I will be referring to virtual reality as VR.

VR is certainly no new concept since we have been trying to perfect it from as far back as 1995.

Though there are many iterations you have always had a limiting factor such as wires or limited movement. Well not

anymore, because with the new Oculus quest you can take a true VR experience anywhere at anytime.
